IN-PERSON ATTENDEE FIRST TIMER'S GUIDE TO FORUM FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

> Welcome to Charlotte, the home of NASCAR racing! We are so glad you are able to attend, and we look forward to connecting with you! The first time at an event like this is overwhelming for all of us so don't feel out of place; we've all been there!

Your Member Council and Talent Council have created these Frequently Asked Questions to try to help ease any anxiety about not knowing where to go or what session to attend or becoming involved in the best way possible. So, rev those engines because it will be a wild ride!

1. What should I expect during my first Forum?

a. You will experience a wide range of sessions with amazing topics to choose from! You'll be able to meet with a wide variety of suppliers at the Expo so take advantage of the easy access!

2. How should I prepare for Forum?

13. What should I do if I encounter technical difficulties or have questions about conference materials?

a. NIGP staff are the best of the best. They will assist you with any and all issues that may arise during the conference.

14. Are continuing education credits available for sessions I've attended?

a. Yes! Your NIGP transcript will show the maximum number of contact hours that can be earned by one's full participation during the Forum. All sessions, with the exception of entity networking sessions, will be recorded and available to watch on demand for 60 days after Forum. Additional contact hours can be earned for on-demand viewing. We recommend keeping a list of the sessions that you attended in case you need this information for your employer, or for professional certifications.

15. How can I maximize my exposure to exhibitors and sponsors at Forum?

- a. BRING YOUR BUSINESS CARDS! Try to meet as many suppliers during the Products Exposition as you can. Emerging Professionals Committee

Joint EP Round Table Survey: Insights from Recent Survey

The Emerging Professionals recently conducted a survey during the joint session with SAMPO to gauge the impact and effectiveness of their presentations. Here's a summary of the key findings:

Memorable Moments

Participants highlighted several memorable aspects of the presentations:

• It provided more context behind the program and benefits that members could get out of it.



- Meeting Future Leaders: Engaging with the next generation of NIGP and Chapter leaders was particularly memorable.
- Collaboration: The collaborative aspect with other municipalities was highly appreciated.

Participants heard about the event through various channels:

- Emails: Direct emails were a common source of information.
- NIGP NSite: Some found the event through the NIGP NSite community.
- Research: A few participants discovered the event while researching educational opportunities on the NIGP website.

Recommendations and Feedback

- Most participants would recommend the program to other emerging/young professionals.
- While the format was appreciated, additional collaboration between NIGP Chapters was recommended.
- It's a great opportunity for networking and meeting more people in the professional field that can assist with questions/scenarios to get a new professional up to speed. Also helps to learn different resources available to someone learning the profession. It is an open forum for Q&A, which helps.

Conclusion

The Joint EP Round Table presentations was well-received, with many participants valuing the opportunity to engage with peers and learn from experienced professionals. The overall response indicates a positive impact and a strong foundation for future development.

The Board of Directors shall:

- Attend the regularly scheduled teleconferences and other meetings of the Board of Directors, and Chapter events.
- Control and manage the affairs and finances of the Chapter.
- Shall have authority to take such actions as will serve the best interests of the Chapter and its Members under an annual plan of activities and budget to be adopted by the membership at the annual meeting of the membership.
- Have no authority to expend or commit funds to an amount over the cash resources of the Chapter, or otherwise cause indebtedness of the Chapter, unless such expenditure, commitment, or indebtedness is approved is in the annual budget, or in advance by 2/3 affirmative vote of the voting members at a regular or special business meeting. Such approval may be by electronic mail or other concurrence.
- Review the recommendation of the Membership Committee and by a majority votes shall accept or reject the applications for membership to the Chapter. The vote of the Board of Directors shall be final. An applicant whose application has been rejected, however, may appeal as specified elsewhere in these Bylaws, or may resubmit an application to the Membership Committee no sooner than one (1) year after rejection by the Board of Directors.
- Hear and decide on appeals regarding the Honors and Awards Committee's decisions on award of scholarships.
